The 5th Annual clean up was held in partnership with Garland, Rowlett, and Dallas on October 23, 2021.

The event was a great success.

117 Volunteers contributed 269 hours and collected 3,460 lbs of litter. 23 tires were pulled from the lake and sent to the recycler.

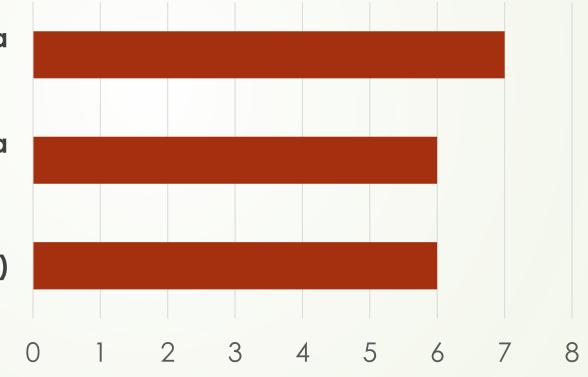
Recycle Roundtable Survey Results.

"Continue to monitor engagement online and make updates as needed"

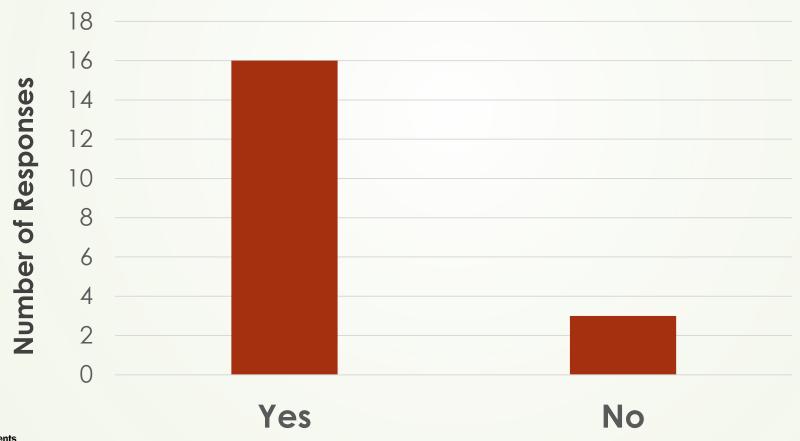
