

Monthly Dual Coordinated Topics

	Dual Recycling Topics	
June	Do recycle aluminum cans; do not recycle picnic supplies.	
July	Do recycle glass, aluminum, and plastic beverage containers (empty the liquids – hydrate yourself, not your cart!); do not recycle propane tanks.	
August	Do recycle plastic (empty) bottles; do not recycle clothing.	
September	Do recycle HDPE containers; do not recycle batteries.	
October	Do recycle glass, aluminum, and plastic beverage containers; do not recycle needles or medical equipment.	
November	Do recycle aluminum and steel cans; do not recycle propane tanks.	
December	Do recycle cardboard (flattened); do not recycle Christmas trees/decorations.	
January 2021	Do recycle cardboard (flattened); do not recycle Christmas trees/decorations.	
February	Do recycle aluminum and steel cans; do not recycle batteries.	
March	Do recycle paper; do not recycle yard waste.	
April	April Do recycle HDPE containers; do not recycle Easter baskets or anything in them (i.e. plastic eggs and grass, candy wrappers, stuffed animals, etc.).	
May	Do recycle cardboard (flattened); do not recycle yard waste (including grass clippings, flowerpots, pallets, soil bags, etc.).

Know What To Throw Campaign


KWTT 2020 Survey Results

Participation Results


In which ways is your organization participating in the campaign?




